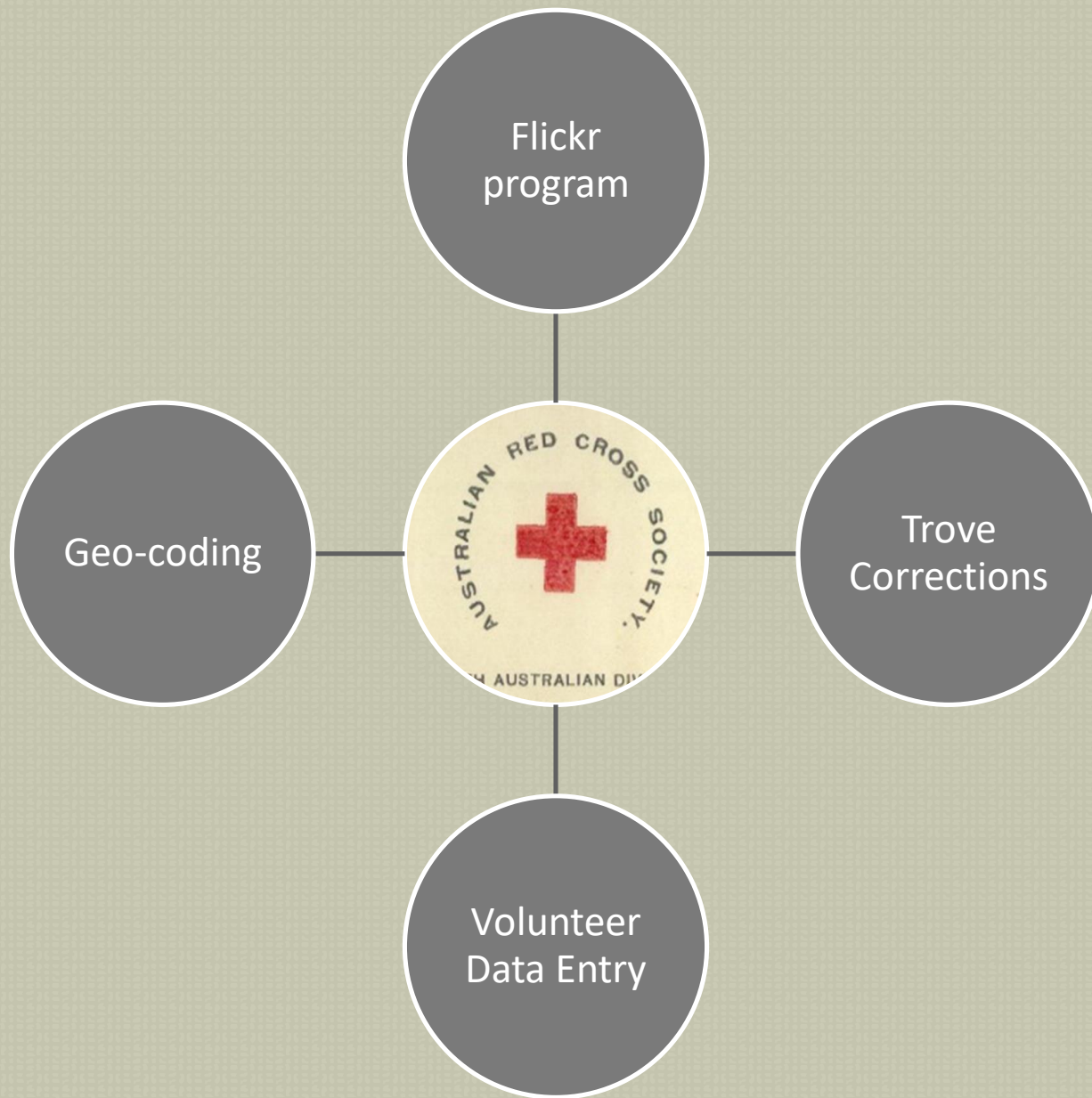

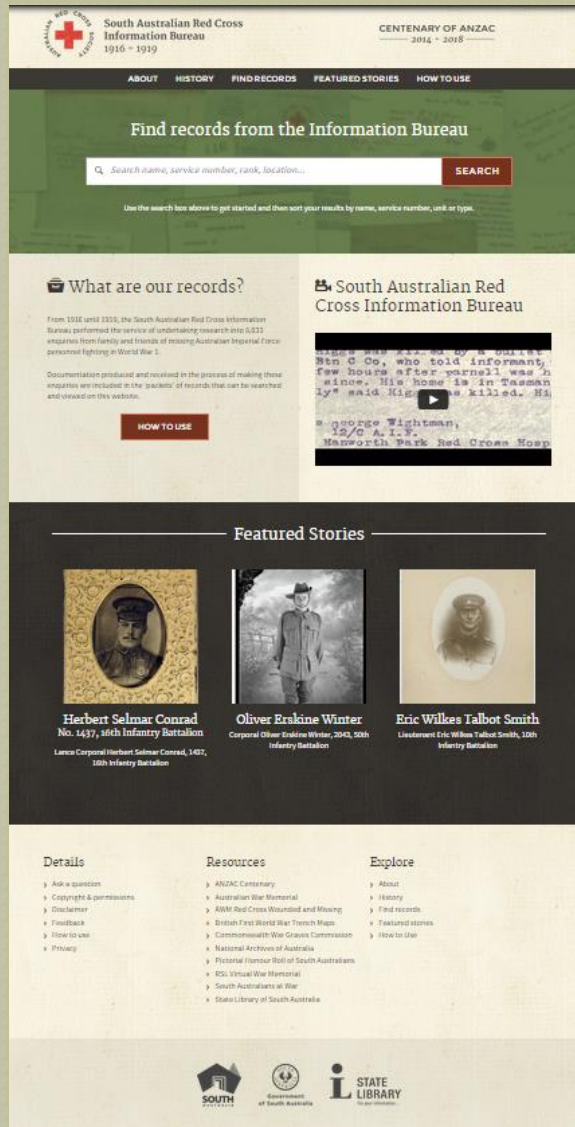

Digitising and project planning


- October 2012 - September 2013
- 76,718 pages scanned - 1.10TB of data
- 8,024 multi-page packets digitized and indexed

Indexing - volunteers

- December 2013 testing
- January - July 2014 – data created
- 40 volunteers - 27 onsite and 13 offsite
- 19,696 names indexed and turned into individual records in the final database - soldiers, nurses, eyewitnesses and enquirers indexed to broaden the appeal and usefulness of the content
- 2700 hours volunteer time - 347 working days

Other volunteer efforts

- 22,000 geo-codes created – July - October 2014
- 4 years of obituaries text corrected between 2014 – 2015
- 800 photos released on Flickr in 2013 and available for comment

South Australian Red Cross Information Bureau database

Deliverables

A publicly accessible, online database of the South Australian Red Cross Information Bureau records. During WW1 each state's Bureau co-ordinated enquiries from families and friends regarding the tracing of wounded and missing soldiers. The results of these enquiries are held within envelopes for each individual enquired upon and contain eyewitness accounts, accounts of burial, hospitalisation, letters to and from military offices and to the enquirers.

This information differs from the Red Cross enquiry files held at the Australian War Memorial (AWM) and is unique to the State Library of South Australia because the South Australian Bureau deposited its records (with more than 8000 enquiries) with the State Library in 1922 while the records of the remaining Bureaux went to the AWM. The Memorial does hold some South Australian content from enquiries that were generated in other states but does not point back to the SLSA's more complete enquiry files. The SA Bureau held a unique distinction of being known for not toning down the details divulged allowing the disturbing realities of trench warfare to be exposed.

The database will aggregate the information regarding South Australian casualties from World War 1 (excluding air and naval personnel), harvest data (or scrape) relevant documents from the Australian War Memorial, National Archives of Australia and Commonwealth War Graves Commission and allow for public participation and engagement by providing the ability to transcribe original documentation and to leave reminiscences where appropriate. With these activities, the public will be able to bring together the details of the missing or wounded.

The database will conform to OAI-PMH standards for database design which will enable the data contained to be exported or data mined for reuse by other agencies as required, enabling a consolidated view of Australian participation in World War 1.

Secondary benefits

- Data that is exportable fulfilling linked data, Resource Description Framework principles to enable reuse of data online.
- Public trust in providing authorised data that is reusable
- Contribution to SA Memory directions and provides a scheduled release of content in the absence of a Content Release or Content Management Plan
- SRG 76 Red Cross Information Bureau Series 1 will be digitised (8000 packets containing letters, witness statements)
- The release of the database will demonstrate the Library's contribution to the Centenary of ANZAC
- Establishes a subsection of a Content Release plan for AIS.

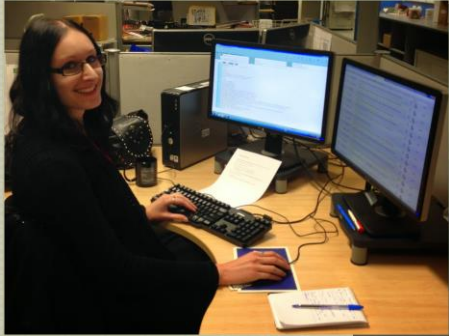

Witness states:- Clift was brought into our trench badly wounded by machine gun, after lying out in a shell hole from Saturday 12th Aug. until following Monday, by Cpl Misgrove - killed next day, - spoke to Clift at the time. Donald Kerr of the A.M.C. dressed him and gave morphia he was in a very bad way. This happened in a German ration trench under the sunken road at Mouquet Farm.

We were on the right of Albert. It was between 10 and 11 that night when he was going up with his Coy. to the front and we were in reserve. He was killed by the only shell that landed anywhere near that spot. He lingered on for a little while, but never regained consciousness. He was carried back to the D/S between Mericourt and Laveville, almost on the main road between Asiens and Albert. I saw his body lying outside the D/S on a stretcher the next morning. I do not know any details as to his burial, but as we have always held that ground there can be no doubt about his being properly buried. Macloy was a medium coloured chap, with not too much hair and a fairly big lump of a chap. He was a South Australian.
