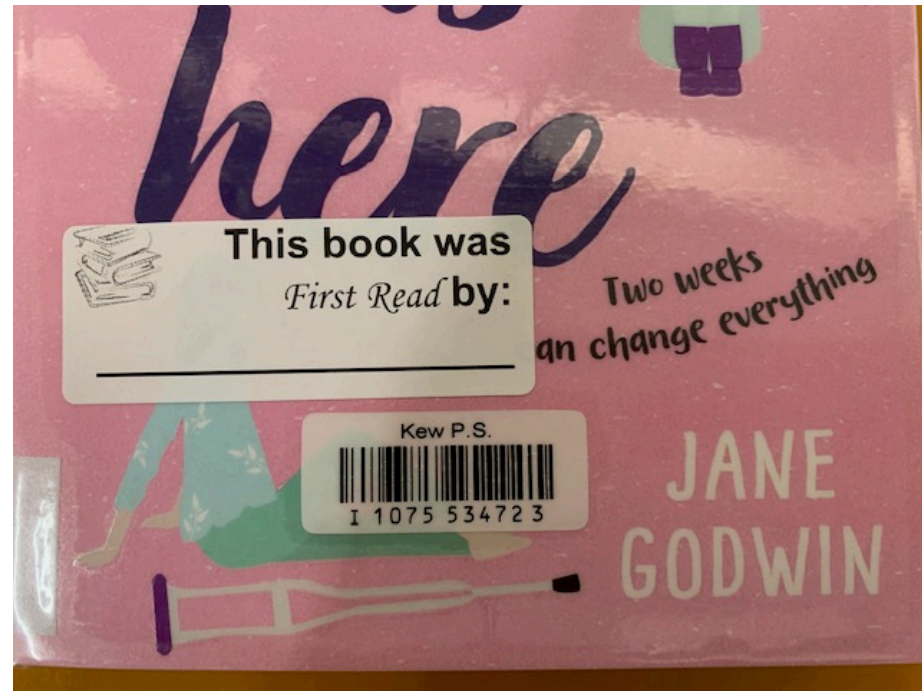

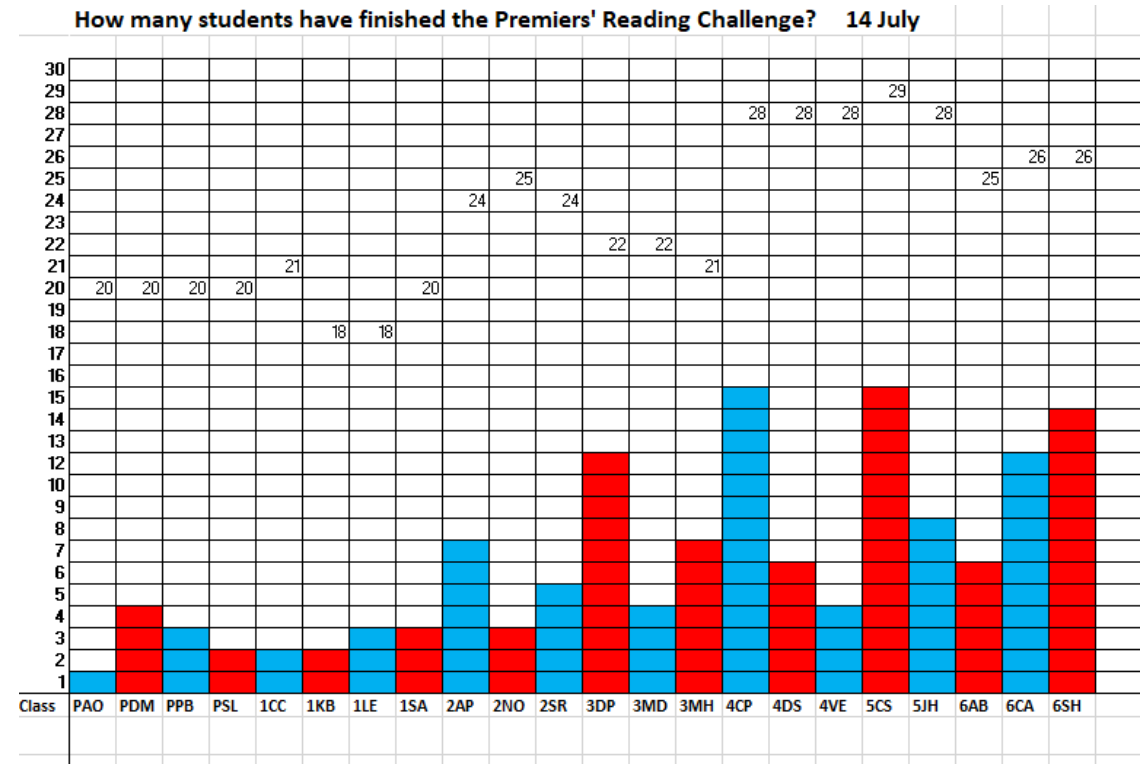


STRATEGIES

JUST RIGHT BOOKS

Add in Just Right poster and 5 finger rule


Five Finger Rule

0-1 = too easy
2-3 = just right
4 = okay to try
5+ = too hard




▪ Open a book to any page. Start reading. Hold up a finger every time you see a word you do not know. ▪

"Just Right" Books Printable for Kids




A book is too easy when

- I know all the words,
- I make no mistakes when I read it,
- I've read it a lot of times, and/or
- I have it memorized.



A book is too hard when

- there are a lot of words I don't know,
- I can't figure out the words I don't know,
- the topic is not familiar to me, and/or
- it does not make sense to me.



A book is "just right" when

- I know most of the words,
- I can figure out words I don't know,
- the topic is familiar to me,
- I am interested in what I'm reading, and/or
- I can understand what I'm reading.
