Why can't we do that now?

- MARC records can't be understood by the web
- MARC doesn't support complex linking relationships between entities







- BIBFRAME Uses Linked Data model
- Adopted FRBR model (Functional Requirements for Bibliographic records)
 - Work
 - Expression
 - Manifestation
 - Item





AIATSIS

The potential to discover and share authoritative information with the wider community

- Establishing appropriate personal name authority headings
- Personal name authorities loaded to Libraries Australia
- VIAF (the Virtual International Authority File)
- VIAF uses linked data technologies





When will BIBFRAME be available?


• BIBFRAME is a work in progress

There are tools to transform MARC records into BIBFRAME






Linked data may be able to show relationships to information in a better way than is currently possible with a hierarchical thesaurus structure
